Upper Westside CID Updates

- Adeline Collot provided updates
- Soon will begin pedestrian and safety improvements to Huff Road
- Waiting for flashing pedestrian lights to start building in August @ Fairmont, Ellsworth Industrial, and others
- We won a grant from the Atlanta Regional Commission for \$200k to study Huff Rd.
- Will put out the request for proposals in late August
- The process will take about a year. Purpose is to create a concept study and develop "30%" design plans.
- This is the first step you must take for a major project
- Will put on their first event on Sunday, October 29th, "Westside Stride" from 12 6PM
- Will close down Howell Mill for pedestrians only from Trabert to Marietta Street
- Live music, food trucks, booths, and more

Council Member Dustin Hillis Updates

- Updates provided by Council Member Dustin Hillis, Atlanta City Council Member for District 9 which includes Blandtown

- Passed the city's fiscal year '24 budget (July 1st June 30th)
- Largest reserve the city has ever had
- Highlights:
 - Legislation to up the parks improvement fund. Hadn't been reviewed since the 1970's. The fund will double from \$16M to \$32M / year

- Importantly, more of that fund will go toward parks improvement and maintenance, not just capital spending. From 10% to 40%, ~\$12M increase
- Began a Parks Ranger program that will also be funded from this
- o Parks Dept will audit all parks, trails, and centers to allocate funds

Resurfacing:

 Will go from spending \$6M to \$18M this year to identify streets in most need of resurfacing

TSPLOST

- Each district gets \$1.5M for horizontal infrastructure (trails, etc.) and \$1.5M for vertical infrastructure (park facilities, etc)
- \$1M will go toward ATL DOT funding for sidewalks and resurfacing
- \$500k will go to PATH for Beltline, Silver Comet, and Proctor Creek Trail developments
- \$500k to establish safety and security cameras throughout the district. Blandtown will get 6 - 8 new cameras and license plate readers.

Beltline

 NW corridor section going from Marietta to English is planning to break ground in Fall of this year and is planned to take about a year for construction

- Happenings:
 - July 30th 12th annual "Attack of the Killer Tomatoes" festival
